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### ARCHITECTURAL CONTROL COMMITTEE (ACC)

When submitting an ACC request for staining a fence, painting your home exterior, or any other project with a color change, please provide a color sample with your request or the website where the color can be viewed. This will help expedite approval of your project.

Also, although the ACC normally responds in less than 10 days, you should, for planning purposes, allow a minimum of 10 days from the time you submit a completed ACC request form before commencing work.

## LANDSCAPE

Winter has arrived, but you would never know it by the temperature. I'm sure that we will long for these warm days once the cold weather arrives. A few things to remember when we have our first freeze. Hydrated plants survive better and don't burn like plants that are dry or dehydrated. If you need to cover or wrap you tender plants in freezing weather, make sure you use frost blankets. These blankets breathe better than sheets and help keep the moisture off the plant, which causes them to burn.

Don't forget to pretreat your lawns for weeds and insects. This will make your lawn look wonderful, and simplify your maintenance next summer.

#### Turn Off Your Sprinklers! Shift to Winter Watering Schedule

Most landscaping goes dormant in the fall, so turn off the automatic sprinkler system and only water as needed. We are transitioning to the Winter Watering Schedule which began November 1. Plano residents and businesses should return to once-a-week sprinkler use, with watering allowed between 10 a.m. and 6 p.m. Daytime sprinkler use improves everyone's safety by reducing the risk of nighttime freezing to avoid preventable icy sidewalks and roadways. Please let me know if you can make this happen!




A reminder will be sent closer to the meeting date.

Below is a synopsis of the book:

On the mountainous border of China and Tibet in 1708, a detective must learn what a killer already knows: that empires rise and fall on the strength of the stories they tell.

Li Du was an imperial librarian. Now he is an exile. Arriving in Dayan, the last Chinese town before the Tibetan border, he is surprised to find it teeming with travelers, soldiers, and merchants. All have come for a spectacle unprecedented in this remote province: an e c l i p s e o f t h e s u n commanded by the Emperor himself.

When a Jesuit astronomer is found murdered in the home of the local magistrate, blame is hastily placed on Tibetan bandits. But Li Du suspects this was no random killing. Everyone has secrets: the ambitious magistrate, the powerful consort, the bitter servant, the irreproachable secretary, the East India Company merchant, the nervous missionary, and the traveling storyteller who can't keep his own story straight. Beyond the sloping roofs and festival banners, Li Du can see the mountain pass that will take him out of China forever. He must choose whether to leave, and embrace his exile, or to stay, and investigate a murder that the town of Dayan seems all too willing to forget.

Police arrived at the location and located a subject matching the description of one of the suspects hiding behind a vehicle.


The investigation resulted in the suspect being arrest for burglary of motor vehicle.
