While we were not able to formally vote on their appointments at the Annual meeting because we did not have a full quorum, both volunteers were still willing to go ahead and jump onto the board. I am sure you will have a chance to meet Celeste and Howard at our upcoming board meeting on January 6, 2021 online or at an HOA event in the future.

I would also like to say "Thank you" again to our new Social Chairperson, Susan Redding and her assistants. Susan is new to the neighborhood, but has jumped right into the fray and come up with a couple of good events to close out the year as responsibly as possible. We hope that you were able to attend the BBQ and Santa Photos events provided by the HOA.

Additionally, as we discussed at our annual meeting, the board intends to apply for the grant from the city to assist with the landscape changes that we are developing for the privacy screen (Leyland Cyprus) and the entrances to the HOA at Browning and Parker; Preston Meadow and Parker; and Sun Valley). Depending on finalization with the city, work could begin in

early spring. We will have more details to provide in a separate blast once we finalize a timeline with the city and vendors, but feel free to fire away with any questions in the interim.





# Anatomy of a Scandal

Sarah Vaughan read English at Oxford and went on to become a journalist. She spent eleven years at the Guardian as a news reporter, health correspondent, and political correspondent. She left to freelance and began writing fiction the week she turned forty. Her debut novel, The Art of Baking Blind, was the result. The Farm at the Edge of the World was published in June 2016 and will be published in Germany and France. Sarah lives in Cambridge with her husband and two children.

#### **Synopsis:**

Sophie's husband James is a loving father, a handsome man, a charismatic and successful public figure. And yet he stands accused of a terrible crime. Sophie is convinced he is innocent and desperate to protect her precious family from the lies that threaten to rip them apart.

Kate is the lawyer hired to prosecute the case: an experienced professional who knows that the law is all about winning the argument. And yet Kate seeks the truth at all times. She is certain James is guilty and is determined he will pay for his crimes.

Who is right about James? Sophie or Kate? And is either of them informed by anything more than instinct and personal experience? Despite her privileged upbringing, Sophie is well aware that her beautiful life is not inviolable. She has known it since she and James were first lovers, at Oxford, and she witnessed how easily pleasure could tip into tragedy.

Most people would prefer not to try to understand what passes between a man and a woman when they are alone: alone in bed, alone in an embrace, alone in an elevator... Or alone in the moonlit courtyard of an Oxford college, where a girl once stood before a boy, heart pounding with excitement, then fear. Sophie never understood why her tutorial partner Holly left Oxford so abruptly. What would she think, if she knew the truth?



### ARCHITECTURAL CONTROL COMMITTEE (ACC)

It has been my pleasure to serve as the Homeowners Association Architectural Chairman since 2016. I will be stepping down from this position in 2021. Please let me know if you would be interested in serving on the committee, or as Chairman of the Architectural Committee. It's easy to submit your project request online. Simply go to <a href="https://hoppr.org">hoppr.org</a>. You will find the ACC application under "Useful Links". There you will find the CMA Management link to login or register. You can complete your ACC application and upload your supporting

documents easily. The applications will be process more quickly than submitting a request on paper. Always provide contact information, either email or phone.

Remember...These are common work items that should be submitted to the Architectural Committee for review.

- Replacement of roofs
- Exterior painting
- Pool installation
- Home additions (extra rooms, garage expansion, driveways)
- Repair/re-staining or replacing, or installing new fences
- Storage buildings, greenhouses, or workshops
- Major landscaping projects including draught resistant landscaping and water conserving turf
- Exterior radio, television or other antennas (excluding those that cannot be seen from the street
- Retaining walls.
- Mailbox modifications

These items are also listed on your most recent HOPPR Summer Directory. When in doubt, check the covenants and restrictions from your HOA.

When submitting an ACC request for staining a fence, painting your home exterior, or any other project with a color change, please provide a color sample with your request or the website where the color can be viewed. This will help expedite approval of your project.

You should allow a minimum of 10 days from the time you submit a completed ACC request form before commencing work.

A complete set of the neighborhood's Declaration of Covenants and Restrictions as well as the required ACC Application Form are available on our website at <a href="https://www.hoppr.org">www.hoppr.org</a>.
