LANDSCAPE

November Tips

November weather can run from delightful to downright chilly. In north Texas, warm season grasses are going dormant with the first freeze and deciduous vines like wisteria are beginning to look tired and droopy.

The clock is ticking to over seed lawns with rye grass if it hasn't already been done. Use rye grass seed to stabilize the soil until spring to reduce unwanted muddy paw print tracks in the house and/or bare areas where soil might wash away during the winter. The beautiful rich green look of rye grass is much nicer than any of the warm season grasses that are starting to look dull. Mowing will need to continue throughout the winter but it will be worth it. For pest control, apply a preemergence herbicide early this month and fertilize late in the month when the warm season grass in the lawn has gone dormant.

November is also the time to finalize plans for cool season bedding plants. Pansies are a great cold hardy annual and will usually add color all cool/cold season. Garden mums are a popular fall blooming perennial and are available now at local nurseries. Buy plants that have few open flowers with

mostly buds for longer lasting color. Make sure to add organic matter during bed preparation. Fertilizer is usually not needed at this time of year. Few, if any, pests bother annuals or perennials in November but continue to be on the lookout for caterpillars, aphids, snails, and slugs and treat if necessary. Weed beds regularly and maintain a good layer of mulch 3 to 4 inches deep to keep weeds under control. Rain in November is usually adequate, but water these plants as needed to maintain a moist soil if weather is dry. Lastly, spring bulbs should be planted this month.

The Vanishing Half

by **Brit Bennett**

Author Biography:

Born and raised in Southern California, Brit Bennett graduated from Stanford University and later earned her MFA in fiction at the University of Michigan, where she won a Hopwood Award in Graduate Short Fiction as well as the 2014 Hurston/Wright Award for College Writers. Her work is featured in the New Yorker, the New York Times Magazine, the Paris Review, and Jezebel. She is one of the National Book Foundation's 2016 5 Under 35 honorees.

Synopsis:

The Vignes twin sisters will always be identical. But after growing up together in a small, southern black community and running away at age sixteen, it's not just the shape of their daily lives that is different as adults, it's everything: their families, their communities, their racial identities. Many years later, one

sister lives with her black daughter in the same southern town she once tried to escape. The other secretly passes for white, and her white husband knows nothing of her past. Still, even separated by so many miles and just as many lies, the fates of the twins remain intertwined. What will happen to the next generation, when their own daughters' storylines intersect?

Weaving together multiple strands and generations of this family, from the Deep South to California, from the 1950s to the 1990s, Brit Bennett produces a story that is at once a riveting, emotional family story and a brilliant exploration of the American history of passing. Looking well beyond issues of race, The Vanishing Half considers the lasting influence of the past as it shapes a person's decisions, desires, and expectations, and explores some of the multiple reasons and realms in which people sometimes feel pulled to live as something other than their origins



ARCHITECTURAL CONTROL COMMITTEE (ACC)

It's easy to submit your project request online. Simply go to hoppr.org. You will find the ACC application under "Useful Links". There you will find the CMA Management link to login or register. You can complete your ACC application and upload your supporting documents easily. The applications will be process more quickly than submitting a request on paper. Always provide contact information, either email or phone.

Remember...These are common work items that should be submitted to the Architectural Committee for review.

- Replacement of roofs
- Exterior painting
- Pool installation
- Home additions (extra rooms, garage expansion, driveways)
- Repair/re-staining or replacing, or installing new fences
- Storage buildings, greenhouses, or workshops
- Major landscaping projects including draught resistant landscaping and water conserving turf
- Exterior radio, television or other antennas (excluding those that cannot be seen from the street
- Retaining walls.
- Mailbox modifications

These items are also listed on your most recent HOPPR Summer Directory. When in doubt, check the covenants and restrictions from your HOA.

When submitting an ACC request for staining a fence, painting your home exterior, or any other project with a color change, <u>please provide a color sample with your request or the website where the color can be viewed.</u> This will help expedite approval of your project.

You should allow a minimum of 10 days from the time you submit a completed ACC request form before commencing work.
