#### LANDSCAPING WPDATE

Early this spring many of you may have noticed three of the Leyland cypress trees bordering Parker Road were removed by the City of Plano. They were diseased and considered a safety hazard.

As the hotter Texas weather has progressed more of the trees have shown signs of the same disease. In fact, throughout the neighborhood and city trees like this are showing signs of the same disease. We have been informed by the City that he Leyland cypress trees along Parker Road will need to be removed completely over a period of years. As unsightly as it may appear today, it could get much worse. The City does not intend to replant the area.

The Highlands of Plano Preston Ridge HOA Board of Directors (Board) has been working with the City to develop a more favorable plan for the neighborhood. Our goal is the replacement of the cypress trees with a new more disease tolerant landscaping barrier for our neighborhood within a year rather than waiting long term for the eventual removal of the last tree by the City in years to come.

The City has agreed to remove the old trees, grind the stumps, and leave the ground in a condition more suitable for new plants. The Board has agreed to replant the area to provide a sound and aesthetic barrier for neighbors on the north end of the HOA and maintain the beauty of the overall area for our neighborhood.

We have established a special Committee to determine the new landscaping design and solicit bids for its

installation. Once the bids are complete, the Board will enter into a formal agreement with the City for the eventual redesign of the area. This includes possible grants from the City to offset some of our costs.

The Committee determined the best type of replacement from a list of landscaping plants approved by the City to assure cost effectiveness, optimal size and shape, and security. The plants selected require limited maintenance and are well adapted to our weather environment. We are currently working on a design to incorporate Burford holly and little gem magnolias into an alternating group pattern of plants. Examples of both of these plants can be seen along Parker Road on the south side as you travel west from our neighborhood.

The new landscaping will eventually rival the height of the current Leyland cypress tree stand but will be more heat and disease tolerant. The Committee anticipates finalizing the design by the end of June. Bids will be requested subsequently and a more accurate timetable will be negotiated with the City for work to begin.

The soil will need to lie dormant for a few months prior to the new planting to assure sterilization from any bacteria known to affect the Leyland cypress trees. The Board will attempt to complete this project within the 2023 fiscal year.







#### ARCHITECTURAL CONTROL COMMITTEE (ACC)

#### A note from CMA Management (in case you missed it)

#### Dear Homeowner:

With the arrival of spring, many homeowners get the urge to refresh their yards and upgrade their properties. When you identify your next exterior home improvement project, please remember these important facts:

- Many projects (including some repairs/replacements) require PRIOR approval by our community's Architectural Control Committee (ACC), as well as close attention to our Modification Guidelines.
- Homeowners who do not receive approval for a required project (or who do not complete a project according to guidelines/as approved) will receive a violation notice.

Why? We uphold these standards because we care. Guidelines support our property values and protect the unique look and feel of our community.

When planning your next exterior project, follow these steps to prevent project delays or the receipt of a violation notice.

- GO ONLINE. Log in to your account at <a href="https://cma.cincwebaxis.com/">https://cma.cincwebaxis.com/</a>.
- READ. Go to Association Info > Documents and carefully read our Modification Guidelines. They contain instructions for solar panels, roofing, sheds, pergolas, pools, flags and flagpoles, landscaping, yard signs, and much more. The guidelines will tell you if an application is required for your project type, what info/documentation you need to provide, and the length of the application review period you can expect.
- INCLUDE. Be sure to include all required info for your project type (e.g., dimensions, product brands, colors, material types, etc.) and to upload all required documentation (e.g., plat survey, images of paint or stain colors, photo renderings, etc.). Incomplete submissions are automatically denied and must be resubmitted.
- SUBMIT. Go to Association Info > ACC Modification Requests and review the info on that page. There, you'll click the 'Add ACC Request' button to start your application.
- CHECK. Your application status will show as OPEN on your homeowner portal until the committee makes their final decision. You will receive the decision letter via your registered email account or via a USPS delivered letter if you do not have a registered email address.

Protecting the aesthetic of our community is truly a team effort. We thank you for paying attention to the details!
